CEO and Chairperson's Report 2022

In 2022 we started to see the benefit and the relief as the Covid pandemic became more under control and the restrictions reduced. Day projects were able to fully reopen and really started to grow and develop from the plans, that we had created in 2021. These plans are three to five year projects and in 2022 many of the first steps were taken.

In L'Arche Cork, with the support of a garden consultant who has considerable organic gardening knowledge and experience, the vegetable garden started to take shape. The plans for the hard landscaping were created and the work for this will be completed in 2023 In addition the local Tomar Trust donated a significant portion of the costs to help us realise this dream, for which we thank them most sincerelu. Most importantly we reignited and

increased our connection with the local area, through gardening talks and other events. We started back doing things that we had been doing prior to the pandemic but also increasing our involvement in other social and community events across the county.

Many of the houses in L'Arche Cork now require additional work to bring them up to standard and we conducted a feasibility study to assist us in understanding the work required. This will continue to be a very large project over the next three to five years.

In L'Arche Kilkenny, the main focus was on reopening fully the day projects but also redesigning them and expanding them in line with the HSE New Directions - Day Projects for adults with disabilities, and with the vision and interest of our core members.

In L'Arche Dublin they continue to focus on residential support. We changed our structures to provide additional support for

core members, through adding the role of Person in Charge. This has proved to be very beneficial

for the running of the community.

During 2022 we completed the Time to Reflect (TTR) Strategic Review and Plan project. This research project enabled us review many aspects of L'Arche through consulting with core members, volunteer assistants, leadership, staff and board. The

project for example reviewed the volunteer model, governance, and the HR systems in place. The review also gave recommendations for the future and these will be key part of our work in 2023 and will be embedded in our Mandate/Strategic plan

for December 2023 to December 2028.

We completed a review of our constitution and plan that our new constitution will be available in 2023.

Building works in Moorefield House were also completed enabling a better use of the existing space and upgrades.

A good year for self advocacy within Kilkenny as the external ID Rights South East became established and a weekly internal advocacy group started. Quarterly Day Project training days became a fixed event giving a great opportunity for all Day Project staff to upskill.

Our Café reinvention to the Culinary Life Skills programme extended out to four days a week with many core members enjoying the Project. Staff wise we were sorry to see Peter Brabazon, Micky Ramsbottom and James Platt leave us. Lion De were delighted to see Linda Fitzgerald appointed as House Leader and later joined by Sharon Barry as Deputy House Leader.

Ger Mullally, stood down as Chair of the Local Committee after a great contribution and loyalty to the Community. In August the L'Arche Café hosted a social evening with Local Committee members, core members and staff. A great night of sharing stories, videos and food.
